

## WHAT TO BRING TO NURSERY

### At the time of registration, we require the following documents:

- Completed Registration Form and Medical Form.
- Signed copies of the First Aid & Medication Administration Policy, Sickness & Communicable Disease Policy and Settling In Policy.
- Copy of child's passport, visa, Emirates ID, birth certificate and 3 passport sized photos.
- Copy of father's passport, visa, Emirates ID and 1 passport sized photo.
- Copy of mother's passport, visa, Emirates ID and 1 passport sized photo.
- Pick-up authorities (*if anyone other than parents, e.g. nanny, grandparents, will be picking up your child*): Copy of passport, visa, Emirates ID and 1 passport sized photo.
- Copy of child's up to date vaccination record.
- Tenancy contract
- Please bring along the original Emirates ID card of both parents and child so we can upload this onto ADEK's online student information system

### The following should be handed to your class teacher on your child's first day:

- Completed "All About Me" form.
- A well packed, healthy, morning snack, lunch and afternoon snack (*if staying after 12:30pm*)
- A large pack of nappies/diapers and wet wipes (*if applicable.*)
- Two complete changes of clothes (*up to five changes of clothes if your child is toilet training!*)
- A freshly filled water bottle - the nursery can refill bottles with water (*no juice please!*)
- Milk bottle (*if applicable, for babies*): Any milk formula must be pre-measured for individual bottles and each bottle pre-filled with water. Please give instructions to your child's teacher regarding preparation.
- Bed/Cot Linen (*if applicable*): The nursery does have a limited supply of bed linen for any babies and children having naps at nursery, however we encourage to you bring your own. This will be washed for you at nursery every week.

### Please note:

All items MUST be labelled with your child's name.

You will receive notice from your child's teacher if the above items need to be replenished.

The nursery does not accept any responsibility for any accidental loss or damage of property.

Children should avoid bringing valuable items to nursery.
